
GBCP and the BBID are also looking at other ways of making the area more welcoming. For example, we want to make the area more accessible for people in wheelchairs, having partial sight etc.


They need frequent access to a toilet and cannot be sure of finding one when they are out. This is a widespread but invisible disability.

The map is one of the ways in which we want to empower people, making our community more welcoming to disabled people and the elderly.

The first Bedminster Toilet Map actually appeared several years ago following a discussion at the Bedminster Older Peoples' Forum. The Forum looked at national research that showed that some people, and not just older ones, felt imprisoned in their homes.
