Being in the right rooms and making our spaces

- Adding value: Take action where there are gaps in policy and strategy and work to align age-friendly strategy with GM and local authority priorities and plans
- Organising: Convene stakeholders and attract resources to work together on issues of joint interest
- *Influencing*: **GM partners** and bring an ageing lens to mainstream policies and programmes.
- Enabling: Act as a platform for views of older people in GM
- Collaborating: Combine research, policy and implementation
- Challenging: Promote a narrative that challenges ageism and focuses on those groups of older people who face the worst inequalities




